Each gift that is contributed to the Appeal makes a real difference because the gifts of many enable our Diocese to deliver needed ministries and services such as heating and grocery assistance to families, health insurance for our retired priests and tuition for our future priests to attend the seminary. For the first time, the Appeal will allow for increased ministry opportunities to our minority Catholic populations as well as grants to our smaller mission parishes. Another new way the Appeal helps those in need is by supporting parents who face the reality of a baby diagnosed with an adverse prenatal diagnosis.
