Dear Parishioners,

In the category of "Better late than never," I humbly present to you a **Annual Financial Report**. This summary report is of the fiscal year which ended June 30, 2014. I apologize for the tardiness of this report; and appreciate your patience. (Please see the bulletin insert)

First of all, on behalf of the Finance Council, let me express my thanksgiving to God's bounty. Secondly, let me express gratitude to your outstanding generosity. Together we are able to do much more, and do it much better. This is both a practical concern and a moral one. The Mystical Body of Christ seems ethereal sometimes, and yet membership imposes a real responsibility to share very tangible treasure. You continue to do that; please keep up the good work.

What does this Report indicate? The first thing it indicates is--as of June 30-- financial health. You may notice that while our expenses have risen 8% from two years ago, in that same time, our income has risen 15%. This enabled us to break even last year. In addition, you will notice (on the backside) our total Cash has grown 35% over two years ago.

Our Expenses As our building gets older, there will be from time to time repairs and little improvements necessary. This accounts for the inconsistency in the "Maintenance" figures. You know that Health Care costs are rising rapidly. We are not isolated from this trend. The "School Assessment" is a program of the bishop to re-energize Catholic Schools in the Diocese, with scheduled increased rates for two more years. "Miscellaneous" is higher because it includes Altar Flowers and the Padre Pio Sodality, handled differently in previous years.

Our Income Most figures here are self-explanatory. It may be helpful to point out, that not all "income" is reported. The Building Fund, for instance, is on the reverse side. Also not included are the parish charities like the Poor Box, Padre Pio Sodality and the St. Bernadette Fund. Also not included are the special collections which you support so generously like the Fraternity Seminary, The school in Columbia, Special Diocesan Collections, or Emergency Relief. The parish passes these on to other beneficiaries.
