**Saint Gertrude Open House**

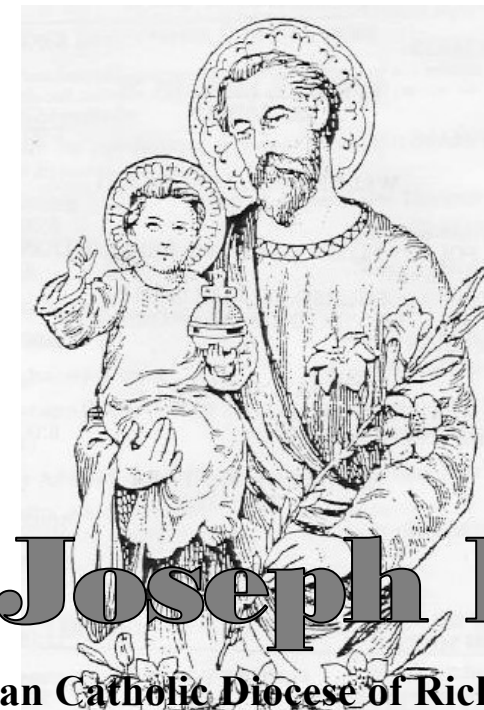
