

Pastor's Corner



Dear Parishioners,

Holy Week: I have a suggestion to make. Read the readings *before* the liturgy. You will be able to pray better, and the texts will come alive in ways they hadn't before. The more you put in, the more you get out!

Palm Sunday: Please note the special schedule: the 8:30 Low Mass will proceed as normal, featuring the recitation of the Passion, but no palm ceremony. The High Mass begins ½ hour early at 10:30 am. (No confessions before or during). We begin with the Procession with Palms, and we will chant the Passion.

Seminarian: The parish is pleased to welcome **Paul Goergen** who will be with us for Holy Week. Paul is studying at Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary in Denton, Nebraska, and is an ordained lector.

Playing with fire: You don't allow your children to play with fire at home, please review these rules for church also. On their own, children should not be lighting the votive candles. Thank you for your understanding. Question: are adults allowed to correct an unattended child who is misbehaving? Yes, but with kindness. Healthy, functional societies allow for this non-parental training as all elders should be respected. [1]

The Passion of Our Savior: In the dungeon of Caiaphas, our Lord awaited a trial by Pontius Pilate. We examined Psalm 88 (87 Douay) in this context and saw how fitting its sentiments were in this light. At the end of the last supper, the apostles "sang a hymn and went out to the Mount of Olives." This hymn is commonly held to be the hymn mandated in a Passover Meal, namely the Hallel or Praise Psalms, 115— 118 (117 Douay). Let's look at a few verses of Psalm 118 in this context: "Give thanks to the Lord; the Lord is gracious, his mercy endures forever. Echo the cry, sons of Israel; the Lord is gracious, his mercy endures forever. ... I called on the Lord when trouble beset me, and the Lord listened, and brought me relief. With the Lord at my side, I have no fear of the worst man can do; with the Lord at my side to aid me, I shall yet see my enemies baffled. ... They swarm about me like bees, their fury blazes up like fire among thorns, but see, in the power of the Lord, I crush them! I reeled under the blow, and had well-nigh fallen, but still the Lord was there to aid me.... The Lord has
