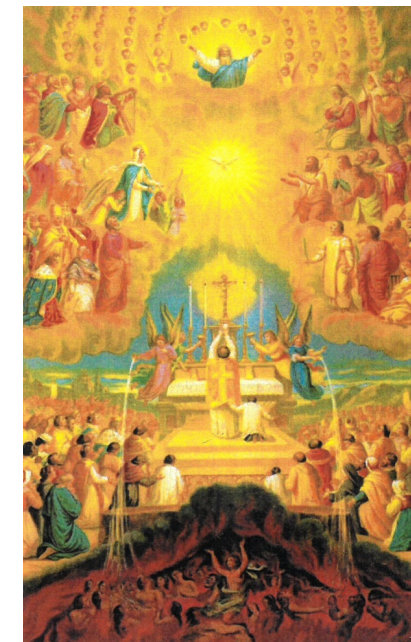
They're Back...
