**Pastor's Corner**



Dear Faithful,

I have been personally asked by the Diocese to remind my parishioners of the directives about masks, that they are mandatory on all Diocesan property.

The diocesan emergency preparedness instruction manual is 119 pages long. This document applies to all parishes, schools, campus ministries, and other diocesan entities and is based on both governmental and health department guidance.

I'll save you the trouble of going through it. You can find the key points summarized in the mandatory notices that have been posted at the entrance of the church and updated since the beginning of the pandemic.

The only change now is the possibility of the State imposing fines if the regulations are not kept.

We are still trying to figure out if our Religious Education program can function within all the restrictions imposed. I will keep you posted.

Please know that you are in your Priests' prayers, especially at the Altar of Our Lord.
