Actual grace is communicated even if a person is in mortal sin. This means that if sanctifying grace is lost, it cannot be recovered without actual grace! This also means that sanctifying grace cannot be preserved in a soul for any length of time without the assistance of actual grace! This helps us understand more the words of St. Therese: "All is grace!"

How good and patient God is with us! How bountifully He bestows his graces on us to bring us back, even after one has destroyed the most wonderful gift of sanctifying grace. May we recognize the value of our state of sanctifying grace and may we be so grateful to God by corresponding to all the actual graces He sends us to deepen that state of sanctifying grace.

Pastor's Corner



Dear Parishioners,

Why did God make us? To know Him, love Him, serve Him in this life and to be forever happy with Him in the next.

It follows that knowing God more should lead one to loving Him more. This is the reason to always study and review our Catholic Faith.

Here is a very brief review of how God's grace works in our lives. Knowing and recognizing God's grace in our lives will be cause for greater gratitude and hopefully a greater corresponding to it.

God shows his goodness to mankind in 2 ways: 1) Naturally, by bringing us into existence ex nihilo and 2) Supernaturally, by raising us to participate in the life of the Most Holy Trinity.

Supernatural life is a share in God's life. It is beyond us. Therefore it is a free gift from God; it is a grace. This grace, like any grace we receive, was merited for us by Our Savior Jesus Christ. The purpose of this grace is to bring us to eternal life. It effects in us justification which means passing from a state of sin to a state of grace and adoption as children of God. God therein gives us sanctifying grace.

Through this supernatural gift, God dwells in a human soul, the person shares in the divine nature and becomes a temple of the Holy Spirit, a friend of God, his adopted child, an heir to the glory of heaven and able to perform actions meriting eternal life. Sanctifying grace is absolutely necessary for us to reach heaven. We increase it by any virtuous action performed. We decrease it by giving in to temptation and venial sin. We destroy it by the committing of a mortal sin. We can at that point regain it by sincere sorrow for our sins and receiving the sacrament of penance.

This brings us to how God enlightens our intellects and moves our wills to do good and to avoid sin for the sake of eternal life. God does so through actual grace. This type of grace differs from sancti-

Church Laws of Days of Abstinence and Fast

Current Practice

Laws of Days of Abstinence

- ♦ Begins on one's 14th birthday.
- ♦ Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent.
- ♦ Obliges abstinence from flesh meat.

Laws of Days of Penance

- ♦ Applies to all the Faithful.
- ♦ Lent and Fridays outside of Lent.

Laws of Days of Fast

- ♦ Applies to everyone aged 18 to 59, inclusive.
- ♦ One full meal permitted and two other meals may be taken which, when combined, are less than a full meal.
- ♦ Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

The obligation to do penance is lifted on Fridays which are also celebrated as a solemnity. The following is a list of the Solemnities in the New Rite which can fall on a Friday:

- ♦ January 1: Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God
- ♦ January 6: Solemnity of the Epiphany
- ♦ March 19: Solemnity of St. Joseph, Spouse of Mary
- ♦ March 25: Solemnity of the Annunciation
- ♦ June 24: Solemnity of St. John the Baptist
- ♦ June 29: Solemnity of Ss. Peter and Paul
- ♦ August 15: Solemnity of the Assumption
- ♦ November 1: Solemnity of All Saints
- ♦ December 8: Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception
- ♦ December 25: Solemnity of Christmas
- ♦ Principal patron of a place (city, state, nation)
- ♦ Dedication of a particular church and the anniversary
- ♦ The Title, founder, or principal patron of a religious order or congregation

The Law of the Eucharistic Fast

Under the New Code of Canon Law, the Fast for Holy Communion is one hour before the reception of the Holy Eucharist. Those who are able to maintain the previous discipline of the three-hour fast are still encouraged to do so.

The Discipline of 1962

Laws of Days of Abstinence

- ♦ Applies on one's 7th birthday.
- ♦ Complete Abstinence: all Fridays of the year, Ash Wednesday, Holy Saturday, and the Vigil of Christmas.
- ♦ Partial Abstinence (meat and soup or gravy made from meat permitted once a day at the principal meal): all the days of Lent, the Ember Days of Wednesday and Saturday, and the Vigils of Pentecost and the Assumption.
- ♦ Abstinence from meat is dispensed on Holy Days of Obligation.

Laws of Fast

- ♦ Applies for those aged 21 to 59, inclusive.
- ♦ Days of Lent from Ash Wednesday inclusive, Ember Days, and Vigils of Christmas, Pentecost, and the Assumption.
- ♦ One full meal permitted and two other meals may be taken which, when combined, are less than a full meal.

The Law of the Eucharistic Fast

The complete fast from all food and drink (except water or medicine) for three hours before the reception of Holy Communion. Those who are able to maintain the midnight fast, which was the previous discipline, are still encouraged to do so.
