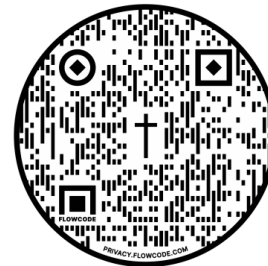

**Pastor's Corner**



Dear Faithful,

Through the liturgy, we are now entering the culmination and the most intense moments of Our Lord's life: His Sorrowful Passion. *"Who in the days of his flesh, with a strong cry and tears, offering up prayers and supplications to him that was able to save him from death, was heard for his reverence. And whereas indeed he was the Son of God, he learned obedience by the things which he suffered: And being consummated, he became, to all that obey him, the cause of eternal salvation."* Hebrews 5:7

Our Lord's entire life had been a preparation for His Passion. His entire life led to it. We are now called to relive these moments, to accompany Him, and to make the most of Him. Think carefully about these words: "To make the most of Him." Will I make the most of Him this Holy Week? How will I go about it?

We live in such a world of distractions. Our attention is solicited for the things of this world constantly. If we give into it without restraint or if we do not keep vigilant about it, we become more and more numb to the eternal realities.

Let us make the most of Him during this Holy Week as we partake in the liturgy with the corresponding interior dispositions. Everything Our Lord did was for me. Everything He suffered is a gift to me. God became man for me. God cried for me. God suffered for me. God died for me.

May our dispositions be those of the good thief, St. Dismas. When Our Lord was being made fun of, when He looked least like a king and least like He owned a kingdom, the good thief corresponded to God's grace. God was looking for a way into his heart. He made a truthful confession: *"We are paying for what we did."* He defended Truth Himself: *"But this man [Jesus] did nothing wrong."* He made a supreme proclamation of faith: *"Jesus, remember me when you come into your kingdom."* And how blessed was he to hear the words: *"In truth, I tell*
