address confessions <u>before</u> Mass-which are just fine.)

Yes, I would agree. The purpose of coming to Mass and especially the Sunday obligation is to adore (which is why the priest stops confessions during the Consecration, steps out, kneels and adores). The reason I am willing to compromise and hear confessions <u>during</u> Mass is that many of our faithful drive from very far away and some have crazy work schedules and cannot make it to confession at scheduled times during the week. That being said, if you've got to go and it's being offered, go!

Does this mean if someone can make it during the week, they should?

Absolutely. Our parish offers about 13 hours of confession time weekly. If someone is serious about "getting back" their state of grace, they should make it to the confessional as soon as possible and not just when it's eventually convenient, at some point. 6:30 a.m. during the week is a really good time!

The line is sometimes very long though and it gets tiring waiting there.

St Anthony Mary Claret was told the same thing. He answered: "Consider the priest in there who's been hearing confessions for the past hours..."

Father, I swung by and you were busy. I asked for an appointment and the next available time is in 2 months. Really???

Yes. Unfortunately, that is the reality. It means that all my available appointments until the time requested are booked. At the end of the

day, it's simple arithmetic- 900:1 Think of it in the professional world: can you swing by a doctor's office without an appointment? If you have a medical emergency, you go to the E.R. Our version of that would be our emergency line for sacramental emergency purposes.

Father, do you give spiritual direction?

From the pulpit and briefly in the confessional. If you want to prepare a list of questions and run them by me in the context of an appointment, I can do that, as my schedule allows.

Father, what are the pros and cons of St Joseph's parish?

Pros: I think we are very blessed with very good people. We are blessed temporally and spiritually. This parish has great potential. Deo Gratias.

Cons: we are clerically understaffed. More to come, God bless you!

Pastor's Corner



Dear Faithful,

I have compiled a list of good candid questions and statements I have received since my being here and I think it would be helpful to give candid answers via bulletins.

Father, what do you do all day???

- There are 5 main things that encompass my duties (These below are not in order of importance)
- 1. The temporal aspect of the parish (not my cup of tea, but it is absolutely necessary. Without it, no Church!) Finances, building maintenance/upkeep/repairs/projects, and... the blessed heap of daily emails I have to triage through. Thanks be to God, I have reliable help in this domain but it is still a big time commitment on a very regular basis.
- 2. The spiritual aspect of the parish: This is in itself a very full-time job. Remember the ratio: over 900 parishioners and growing(!) for 2 priests. The Sacraments: yes, every single one of them, from Baptism to the Last Rites, with some that take much longer than others (marriage prep) and some that occur at the most unexpected time but for which we drop everything, unless we are at the Altar already (Sacramental emergencies). Christ Our Lord established these beautiful signs to give us grace. It is a priority and a privilege to be able to "feed His flock" with the means He intended.
- 3. The Diocese: I am granted faculties for my ministry through His Excellency the Bishop of Richmond. There are many guidelines and requirements promulgated by the diocese for the common good that I have to answer for.
- 4. The FSSP: My community also has requirements for its members and a rule of common life to be observed in our apostolates. As an FSSP priest, this is not optional.
- 5. My prayer life: I cannot give what I don't have. Without a good prayer life, I would quickly turn into an empty husk. Every day, I must seek My Lord and beg Him the grace I need to carry out my ministry. I have my non-negotiables: Breviary, Spiritual reading, mental prayer, rosary, devotions and the Sacraments. This is so important that it should take an emergency for me not to fulfill this daily.

Father, it seems irreverent to hear confessions <u>during</u> Mass on Sunday. (N.B. This statement does not
