**Pastor's Corner**



Dear Faithful,

I said I would keep you posted on any progress of the Motu Proprio and its effect or application for our parish. Last month, the FSSP Priests serving in the Diocese of Richmond wrote a letter to His Excellency Bishop Knestout. We shared our concerns (it is unclear how the Motu Proprio pertains/applies to an FSSP parish) and our surprise (The Catholic Virginian published unfortunate articles which certainly do not reflect how we think or what motivates us to do what we do, here at St. Joseph's).

This week, we received a very kind and positive reply from His Excellency, acknowledging our concerns. He mentioned that he did not foresee any changes in the current liturgical practice in the personal parishes that have already been established in the diocese and that he would issue a statement in the coming weeks giving guidance on the implementation of the Holy Father's instruction.

Let us continue to pray for our diocesan shepherd in these difficult times. We are very blessed to have what we have at St. Joseph's. May we remember also that the goal of everything we do here (liturgically and otherwise) is to grow closer to Our Blessed Lord and to love Him always more.

Various projects:

-New doors are being installed where they were most needed. The weatherstripping and finishing touches still need to happen. And yes, they will eventually be painted.

-There are 2 A/C units that demand our attention. The vestibule's is being repaired and one of the wings of the building needs a new one. Quotes have been signed. We are just waiting on parts.

-The (pewless) Chapel is once again open as the leaks coming in from the courtyard have been fixed. Renovation plans are in the works.

May God reward you for your generosity. Please know that you and your families are in my prayers, especially at the Altar of Our Lord.
