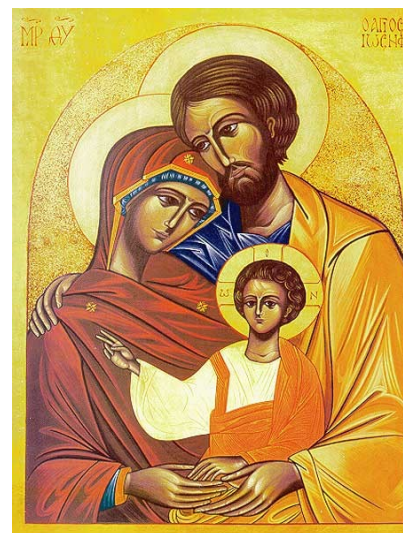

Pastor's Corner



Dear Parishioners,

I hope all of you had a contemplative Christmas and feast of the Epiphany. I would like to thank all of you for your great generosity to the parish. It is a beautiful testimony to the place God holds in your life and in your hearts. May God reward you.

I am not sure what this year will bring, insofar as trials and hardships. One thing I am absolutely certain of is that God's grace will never fail us. Our part is to be faithful, no matter what. Let us cling to our faith and prayer life, that God may show us what we need to do and give us the strength to do it.

We had the feast of the Holy Family earlier this month. Family is the "first cell" of society. If you take a look at our society, this tells us how ailing that "first cell" is.

Here are a few points from the sermon on the Holy Family that are worth keeping in mind:

-Family life is an altar where each member must sacrifice for the good of the whole. A father must sacrifice himself at this altar for the good of the family. So must a mother. The children must be trained to approach this altar over and over again to sacrifice for the good of the family. This is a striving and holy family, in the midst of the trials, twists and turns.

-An unholy family is characterized by prevailing selfishness, when a member's self-focus is to the detriment of the family. Now granted, some members, no matter how well they were trained and brought up, will use their free will to make poor choices, selfish choices which make the family suffer. This is unavoidable, as fallen human nature is ingrained with selfishness. The hope is that through the other members' example, prayers and offered-up sufferings, the black sheep one day returns to the fold.

-The devil is very crafty in fostering selfishness in order to destroy families. One of the many wiles
