Some priests kept the doors to their church open while other parishes around kept them shut. They were reported by visitors (whose parishes were shut down!) for not adhering to the guidelines or for not providing the Sacraments in the manner they expected.

Some priests made it “parishioners only” and created sign-ups in order to avoid being denounced by outsiders, and yet were tackled from behind by some of their own faithful who disagreed with one point or another.

I cannot imagine a more divisive scenario than the one we have experienced the past year. Please know that I will keep doing my best to provide the Sacraments to you and if there is a hill I deem worth dying on, I’ll be ready for the fight.

Now, dear parishioners, all this having been said, I count my blessings. I know priests who are in conditions that would have made me lose my mind! I count my blessings because I have had continued support from the vast majority of you - in your prayers, your generosity and your kindness. As we can finally breathe a little more freely, and parish life resumes in a more normal fashion, may we always remember the reason why we come here: His Sacrifice on the Altar. May God bless you abundantly!

Pastor's Corner



Dear Faithful,

The COVID restrictions are finally being lifted. For more details and current diocesan protocols, please follow this link: <https://richmonddiocese.org/coronavirus/>

What to expect: the blue tape is gone, as is the social distancing. The social gatherings after Mass will resume as before. Most people will not be wearing face coverings, some will be. The diocese has made it extremely clear that someone (whether masked or not) cannot be asked if he has received the vaccine or not. Please observe this directive in a spirit of fraternal charity.

Question/Answer: Someone asked the other day: Father, has this past year taken a toll on priests?

Well, I think it has taken a toll on everybody. The people I have seen suffer most, right at the outset of the pandemic, are the daily communicants who could not receive Our Lord in the Eucharist or stay in the Lord's House as a place of prayer. The majority of them were sad, angry, confused, hurt and felt betrayed—which I understand. What an ordeal this has been...

My objective from the beginning was to do what was necessary to be able to provide the Sacraments to my faithful. This does come at a price, and sometimes a steep one, but the Lord must will it or I would be elsewhere doing something entirely different. A Priest without faculties and ministry is very limited in what he can do for the faithful (aside from prayer).

I have been in contact with many priests during this shutdown; for some of them restrictions still have not lifted. Pray for them.

There were priests who tried as best they could to follow guidelines and were treated in an odious manner by their parishioners - sometimes met with threats, insults and violence.

Some priests tried to do what they could to appear to follow the guidelines and were accused of cowardice by their own, or of not doing enough or of doing too little.

Some priests did not really follow guidelines and were swiftly reported to the CDC and to their respective dioceses, sometime with consequences and sometimes without.
