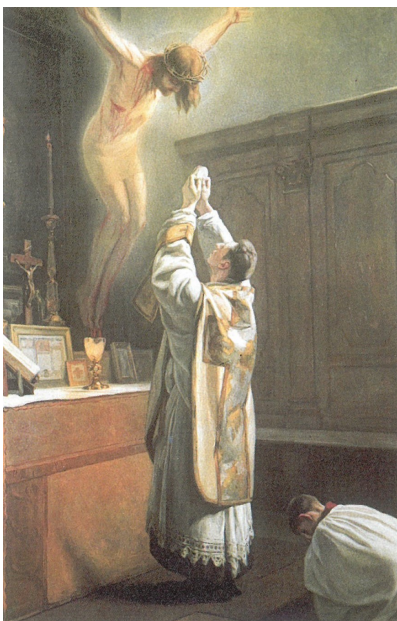

Pastor's Corner



Dear Parishioners,

God has given us the greatest gifts: Himself, His Sacrifice for our salvation, His Flesh and Blood as our food and drink to unite us to His Sacrifice.

There is a saying: "routine kills all devotion" or "we don't know the blessings we have until we lose them." May this never be the case regarding our devotion to Holy Mass. Because of the burden of fallen human nature, it takes effort and regular "tuning" to make sure we escape tepidity.

If someone who knew nothing of the Catholic Faith walked in during Sunday Mass at St. Joseph's, based on what he saw, based on our external behavior, would he come to the conclusion that something extremely sacred is taking place at the Altar? External behavior is a reflection of internal dispositions. But this cuts both ways. Poor external behavior can certainly be a reflection of a lack of interior dispositions; good behavior a reflection of good interior dispositions. Certainly, we want to stay away from the pharisaical whited sepulchers on the outside while full of rot on the inside.

Let us also remember the commandment to keep the Sabbath holy. Here are a few points to consider:

-Keeping holy the Sabbath is a divine commandment no one can be ever be dispensed from, whether one is able to or unable to attend Holy Mass on Sunday.

-Holy Mother Church has made it a precept to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of obligation. One can be dispensed from this obligation for a grave reason. (The dispensation granted by the Bishop due to COVID will end on June 26th.)

-Being "physically present" on the premises of St. Joseph's during Sunday Mass does not necessarily fulfill one's Sunday obligation.

-There is an awful lot of traffic, chatter and conversations in the hallways during Sunday Mass. There seems to be a surge in traffic and bathroom breaks especially around sermon time and even during the Consecration! I can't read hearts and there are times when necessity and nature call... but we seem to have a problem.
