Pastor's Corner



Dear Parishioners,

Some updates and news:

-Fr. Harkins arrived in Texas and is getting settled in. From what I have witnessed and heard, he has certainly left his mark here. We will miss his help, his sermons, his humor... and his haircut! Please keep him and his new parishioners in your prayers.

-The financial report for St. Joseph parish is printed and copies are available on the vestibule bulletin board. Please look it over. The numbers speak for themselves. I am humbled by your generosity. So many parishes have been struggling since the shutdown last year, both financially and with attendance. We can count our blessings. May the Good Lord reward you abundantly.

-I would like to thank all the volunteers who came in great numbers for our outside Fall clean-up. What a difference and an improvement your work has made!

-As you know, parts of our building are now ancient. There are constant repairs and replacements needed. Here is a list of our most recent repairs/replacements: new doors on 6 different entries (paint job on the metal doors pending), courtyard fixed (no more flooding in the building after torrential rains), vestibule AC had a compressor replaced. Plus there is all the scheduled maintenance and checkups for the building (alarms, our beloved boiler, electric...)

-The construction world has been shaken by the shutdown. The supply and demand on materials caused prices to skyrocket; some have come down, but unfortunately everything seems to be on backorder. We are inching closer to several projects while others are on the back burner:

- Playground/field/picnic area (the county is finishing their review and requirements. Once that is done, grading can begin.)
- New storage shed for our outside equipment
- Gutters for the North side and the front entrance of the building
- New AC unit for one wing of the building
- Sanctuary project (gold-leafing and patterns)
- Small chapel to be gutted and renovated
