Illness? Stay Home.

I would like to recall some basic principles regarding church attendance if one is ill.

Keep in mind the Catechism of the Catholic Church does not say that you must be “seriously ill” to have just reason to miss Mass. It says that illness (without qualification) constitutes a “serious reason” that justifies missing Mass on a Sunday or holy day.

Hopefully these questions will help one make a prudent decision.

-Am I contagious? (If so, please stay home!)

-Can I travel safely without putting my life or others’ in danger due to the effects of my illness?

-Can I sit through Mass without running relays to the bathroom?

-Should I “tough it out” and attend even though I am sick and do not feel well but could contaminate someone for whom a flu might be lethal?

-Is my immune system compromised (from a condition, a sickness) and the slightest illness would be severe?

-Must I stay back to care for someone who is sick?

As we revel in the mysteries of the Incarnation of Our Savior and His Epiphany, may we imitate the Three Kings in their worship. They came from afar, on a long and perilous journey to bring Our Lord their gifts. They were corresponding to grace. They were seeking the True King. Their following of the star guiding them to Our Lord is a symbol of the role faith should play in our lives.

Epiphany water was blessed on the eve of the feast and is available. Please find below the blessing for the entrance of your home with the blessed Epiphany chalk.

Here is a little tutorial on what should be done at the main entrances of your homes:

-The finished inscription should look like this:

20 + C + M + B + 22

- The following words in bold are spoken aloud by the head of the family. As he speaks, he writes the part of the inscription listed in italics.

The three wise men,

Caspar, C

Melchior, M

and Balthasar, B

followed the star of God’s Son who became man

two thousand 20

twenty-two years ago. 22

Crosses are added from left to right as follows:

May Christ bless our dwelling, +

& remain with us throughout the new year, +

& grant that our comings and goings +

will be in search of truth. +

Almighty God, incline your ear. May you bless us and all who are gathered here. Send your holy angel who will defend us and fill with grace all who live here. Amen.

Thank you for your generosity. Please know that you and your families are in my prayers, especially at the Altar of Our Lord.
