burn it in the fireplace or grill. If you can't do this, then give them to your friendly neighborhood priest who can do that for you. Make sure vou mark it as "to be discarded."

A few notes on some popular sacramentals:

Holy Water: holy water is available in the Church. If the containers are low or empty. please let us know so we can bless more. But remember, a little holy water goes a long way. You only need a few drops sprinkled with faith to receive the "full strength" of the blessing.

Brown Scapular: In order to benefit from the promises given to those who wear a scapular, vou must first be enrolled. Once enrolled always enrolled, and subsequent scapulars don't need to be blessed, although they can be. Information is easily found online. If you need to be enrolled in the scapular, please contact the office so we can schedule a time. We will also offer this every year on the Sunday closest to the feast of Our Lady of Mount Carmel (July 16). The same goes for the other various kinds of scapulars (e.g. Scapular of the Precious Blood, Seven Sorrows, etc).

# **Pastor's Corner**



Dear Faithful,

Sacramentals are wonderful tools to help us grow in our spiritual lives. We priests bless the sacramentals every Monday morning. Let's take a quick look at the Baltimore Catechism:

**Q. 1052.** What is a sacramental? **A.** A sacramental is anything set apart or blessed by the Church to excite good thoughts and to increase devotion, and through these movements of the heart to remit venial sin.

Q. 1053. How do the Sacramentals excite good thoughts and increase devotion? A. The Sacramentals excite good thoughts by recalling to our minds some special reason for doing good and avoiding evil; especially by reminding us of some holy person, event or thing through which blessings have come to us. They increase devotion by fixing our minds on particular virtues and by helping us to understand and desire them.

**Q. 1054.** Do the Sacramentals of themselves remit venial sins? **A.** The Sacramentals of themselves do not remit venial sins, but they move us to truer devotion, to greater love for God and greater sorrow for our sins, and this devotion, love and sorrow bring us grace, and the grace remits venial sins.

With this in mind, let's get some sacramentals. If you are new to the parish (or visiting), how do you get your new Rosary blessed? Simple: place your item (with your name and phone number) on the "Blessing Table." It is located near the parish office past the Fr. Adrian Hall. Place your unblessed items on the designated side. When they are blessed, we will put a sticker and move them to the other side. Don't forget to get your item once it is blessed. Anything that is unclaimed after three months becomes property of the parish.

Make sure you treat your blessed sacramentals with reverence and devotion. This is more than just any object. Remember, those who use sacramentals with reverence can receive many graces. When a blessed Rosary breaks, rather than throwing it in the garbage, you should either bury it in the ground or
