Pastor's Corner



Dear Parishioners,

<u>Disclaimer 1</u>: I am very grateful to so many of you, parents, who are considerate and circumspect in your parenting. According to our records, we have a total of 384 children at St. Joseph's, of which 264 are between ages 0-5. Most of you do an admirable and, quite frankly, a heroic job.

<u>Disclaimer 2</u>: Many parishioners really take to heart the importance of Holy Mass and dress for the occasion.

There are two difficult topics I need to address: 1) Responsible parenting & noise in church. 2) Modesty in church.

These are difficult topics to address because of the extreme response they usually trigger, whether it is from the perpetrators themselves or those who suffer from their actions.

Here are some reminders that pertain to common sense (which is unfortunately not so common).

1) Responsible parenting & noise in church:

- What is the purpose of coming to church? TO PRAY. What is the purpose of attending Holy Mass? To participate and adore. What is the purpose of hearing a sermon? Hearing words which may help you to love Christ more. I do not expect a parish church to be as quiet as a contemplative monastery but if your child is making noise to the extent that it is detrimental to the above goals, step out into the vestibule. That is the expectation. Judging when the threshold has been crossed and action is required on your part is where common sense should come in. If insufficient action or no action comes from you then I have to step in for the sake of the common good.

On Sunday June 26th, the 8:30 a.m. and the 4:30 p.m. were exemplary (and there were many families with young ones attending). The 11 a.m. was just awful and it was constant. At one point, I couldn't hear a penitent in the confessional due to the screams coming from the nave of the church!

Some things to consider:

- Would I go to the movies or to a symphony and subject people there to what I have just imposed on my fellow parishioners? *No one would take it.*
- We can get desensitized to certain sounds. I have seen it in some parents with extraordinarily lively kids. *Ignoring it does not mean it doesn't exist!*
