- All parish events will go through the Event Coordinator who will ensure that my vision for a particular type of event is communicated to the appropriate Leads, who then take my vision and organize and run the event with any needed input from the Event Coordinator.
- The kitchen in Fr. Adrian Hall is St. Joseph's kitchen. You are welcome to utilize it for lunch on Sundays and the like, but all personal items should be taken with you when you leave.
- We have purchased new appliances for the kitchen. They are available for use by anyone or any group who has been granted permission to use the Hall or the kitchen. Personal appliances should not be kept in the kitchen.
- Personal food items must be labeled before being left in the fridge. Labels are available on top of the fridge. As noted on the fridge door, items are discarded after one month or at the expiration date.
- For liability purposes, children under 16 are not allowed in the kitchen without a supervising adult.
- Only disposable cups and utensils will be stored in the kitchen, with the exception of items used to prepare and serve food for church events. These items will be stored in labeled cabinets.
- Everyone is expected to tidy up after themselves. This is the considerate and charitable thing to do.

- With the help of the new team members, the Volunteer and Event Coordinators will be reviewing and documenting the responsibilities of the groups.

It is my hope that as we move forward with our new teams and new procedures, we make this a well-oiled machine: low maintenance, no drama, and with the great intention of loving Christ and loving Christ in our neighbor. *Ubi caritas est amor, Deus ibi est!*

**Pastor's Corner**



Dear Parishioners,

A great response! I would like to thank everyone who came out for the Volunteer Fair. Thank you for answering my call for help. You are needed and appreciated! This Parish is a residence of the Lord. You are dedicating your time, effort, skills (and sacrifices!) to care for His residence. Remember, this is for love of Him. We volunteer for love of Him. We do this for love of Him. If He isn't our priority, it won't work.

**Some practical planning:** I have appointed a Volunteer Coordinator and an Event Coordinator. Under my direction, they have begun the process of organizing teams for each of the volunteer areas. They will have this task finished soon and will be reaching out to you on a rolling basis within the next few weeks. This is a new system and it will take a bit of time, so have patience with us and know that we will be contacting you soon!

**Growth & Changes:** Our parish has grown significantly in the past 2 1/2 years. There is more of everything: certainly more work and thankfully, more parishioners who really want to be of help. I have been wanting to establish an adequate and efficient volunteer system for the long haul. Of course, I also have to navigate compliance with diocesan and civil directives. This means there will be changes in the way the volunteer system is structured and run. I believe these changes are necessary for the long-term success and efficiency of our volunteer teams.

**A new beginning:** I have instructed the Volunteer and Event Coordinators on how I would like to see things run. (Did you know they are volunteers, too?) Their jobs are to help me get things "up and running" again.

**The specific changes which I deem necessary:**

- Everyone will be assigned to the team or teams for which they volunteered. Responsibilities will be assigned based on your availability.
- We will have rotating teams of volunteers for specific areas. Many hands make light work!
- We will assign a "Lead" for each of the volunteer areas. The Volunteer Coordinator or the Event Coordinator will work directly with the Leads for each area, ensuring we are all focused on the same goals that I have decided upon.
