Pastor's Corner



Dear Parishioners,

We are part of the Church Militant here below, in this valley of tears. We honor the Church Triumphant on the feast of All Saints' (November 1st). We remember in our prayers and sacrifices the Church Suffering, i.e., all the Holy Souls in Purgatory.

We just covered Fr. Hardon's chapter on Purgatory in the RCIA class. Here are some excerpts that will help us remember our faithful departed, especially this month of November:

- What is Purgatory?

Purgatory is a state or condition in which the souls of the just, who die with the stains of sin, are cleansed before they are admitted to heaven. This cleansing is necessary, for "nothing unclean may come into it..." (Revelations 21:27)

In the above definition, "the just" are those who die in the state of grace. "Stains of sin" refer to the temporal punishment still due to venial or forgiven mortal sins.

-Are the souls in Purgatory saved?

Yes, the souls in Purgatory are certain they are saved. It is for this reason that their suffering is only temporary. They experience the pain of temporary loss of the vision of God.

The sufferings of Purgatory are more intense than any suffering on earth. The souls in Purgatory cannot make satisfaction for their sins as merit is possible only during one's lifetime on earth. They do however experience intense spiritual joy because they are absolutely sure of their salvation.

-How can the faithful on earth help the souls in Purgatory?

The faithful on earth can help by their suffrages, that is, through the Sacrifice of the Mass, prayers, almsgiving, and every kind of good work. We have a duty of justice and charity to help the souls in Purgatory.

-Can we invoke the souls in Purgatory?

Yes, we can invoke the souls in Purgatory and are encouraged to ask them with the confidence of being heard. They understand our needs and are extremely grateful for the prayers and sacrifices we offer on their behalf.

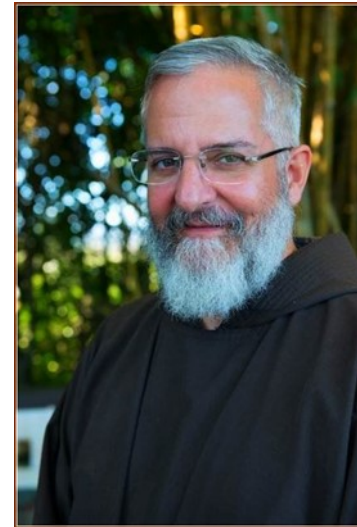

Rev. Fr. Joseph Tuscan, OFM Cap., was professed as a Capuchin Franciscan Friar in the Province of St. Augustine in Pittsburgh, PA in 1990 and ordained to the priesthood on June 7, 1997. After ordination, his first assignment was to the remote Southern Highlands Province of Papua New Guinea in the South Pacific where he served as a missionary priest until September 2001. From 2001 to the present Fr. Joseph has served in a variety of capacities, including, military chaplain, hospital chaplain, director of priestly formation, pastor, and mission/retreat ministry. Currently, Fr. Tuscan is the national director of the Archconfraternity of Christian Mothers and is in full-time preaching ministry for the Capuchin Province of St. Augustine, offering retreats and reflection days for parishes, Religious, and Priests.
