Pastor's Corner



Dear Faithful,
 On Divine Mercy Sunday, the practical aspect of the sermon was how to be a striving repentant sinner and properly using the confessional to that end. Here are some of the bullet points:

How to be a striving repentant sinner, practically?
 When you go to confession and you recite your act of contrition, those last words are so important: "I firmly resolve, with the help of Thy grace, to confess my sins, to do penance and to amend my life." Do you mean it?!

When you go to confession, ask yourself this:
 -Have I prepared my confession? If I died right now and appeared before Christ, what would I be most sorry for? No excuses, no hiding, no blaming others. Just me in front of My God. That sets the stage for a good and humble examination of conscience.

-Do I confess my sins sincerely and with simplicity, without exaggerating or excusing them? Is my confession complete? If I have mortal sins, then species and number (to the extent that it is possible). What invalidates a confession in this realm is willingly and willfully holding back a mortal sin.

-Then, when I say my act of contrition and I say, "I firmly resolve to amend my life": do I mean it? What is my plan? Is it practical? We should be on our guard that confession never becomes something trivial. In Confession I hear the direct words of Christ to me: "I absolve you from your sins". What importance do I attach to these words? He cleanses me in His Blood, He bestows on my soul the merits of His Passion, to forgive me and strengthen me. What response will I give Him? Unfortunately, in places where confessions are seldom heard, people stop going. And unfortunately, in places where confession is offered and made regularly available, some take it for granted and make it a trivial matter.

Finally, remember the words of old timer priests about going to confession (the 3 "B's"): Begin, be brutal and be gone. We go to confession to hear the words of Christ—that's the purpose, and He gives these words to us through His poor instruments to whom He said as He breathed on them: "Receive the Holy Spirit, whose sins you forgive, they are forgiven, whose sins you retain they are retained." I prepare, I go to confession. I hear the words of Christ. I receive His Mercy.
