Recharge your Batteries! Men’s Retreat

The parish is hosting a silent retreat for men ages 18 and up, Fri-Sun., May 19-21, 2023 at the Roslyn Retreat Center on River Road. This traditional retreat will be led by Fr. Joseph Tuscan, OFM, Cap.

The retreat begins on Friday evening with an optional pizza and dessert dinner at 5pm in the outdoor pavilion on the grounds of the Retreat Center. The first conference is at 6pm and Holy Mass is at 8pm.

On Saturday, there are several conferences, times for confession/quiet reflection, and a Holy Hour. Note that there is an outdoor trail with the Stations of the Cross available for all participants.

The retreat concludes on Sunday with Holy Mass, breakfast, a closing conference, and a Q&A session.

The cost, which includes lodging, meals, and snacks from Friday dinner through Sunday breakfast, is \$285 for single rooms with private bathroom and \$255 for rooms with a roommate. Shared rooms are limited.

Registration began Sunday, 2 October for St. Joseph Parish parishioners; registration will open to other men on November 1st. Registration forms are on the bulletin board in the hallway near the Parish Library. Return the completed form to the office either in person during office hours, or through the letter slot in the office door. Payment is due at registration, made payable to St. Joseph Parish. Please note "Men's Silent Retreat" on the memo line of your check. If you prefer to pay with cash, please clearly mark the envelope with your name and “Men’s Silent Retreat.” Your place is not reserved until payment is received.

Periods of quiet, peace, prayer, and reflection are vital in our pursuit of holiness. Come recharge your batteries with some powerful talks geared directly toward men, some quiet time for reflection, plus Adoration, Benediction, Confession, and daily Latin Mass.

The Month of the Holy Souls

On all the days from November 1 through November 8 inclusive, a plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Poor Souls, is granted (under the usual conditions*) to those who visit a cemetery and pray, even if only mentally, for the departed. Partial indulgences are granted to those who recite Lauds or Vespers of the Office of the Dead, and to those who recite the prayer “*Requiem aeternam dona eis, Domine, et lux perpetua luceat eis. Requiescant in pace*” (“Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord, and let perpetual light shine upon them. May they rest in peace”).

Nov. 2—All Souls Day

On this feast, priests may say three Masses. We have scheduled Low Masses at 7 am, 7:30 am, and 8 am (times approximate), as well as 12 noon, 12:30 pm, and 1 pm (times approximate). The High Mass is at 6 pm.

All are welcome to attend any or all of these Masses, but are reminded that the faithful are only permitted to receive the Blessed Sacrament twice in one day.

Also on this feast, a plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Poor Souls, is granted (under the usual conditions) to those who visit any parish church or public oratory and there recite one Our Father and one Credo.

On Indulgences

- A. Indulgences, which remove temporal punishment due to forgiven sin, may be gained by the living for themselves or applied to the souls in purgatory but they cannot be applied to other living persons.
- B. Indulgences are called plenary if they remove all temporal punishment and partial if they remove only some of it.
- C. A plenary indulgence can be acquired only once in the course of a day but a partial indulgence may be acquired more than once a day.
- D. To gain an indulgence for oneself one must be baptized, in the state of grace at least at the completion of the prescribed work and subject to the one granting the indulgence. He must also have at least a general intention of gaining them and must perform the works enjoined at the time and in the manner prescribed.
- E. “To acquire a plenary indulgence,” the 1999 *Enchiridion of Indulgences*, issued by the Sacred Penitentiary, states, “it is necessary to perform the work to which the indulgence is attached and to fulfill the following three conditions: sacramental confession, eucharistic Communion, and prayer for the intention of the Sovereign Pontiff. It is further required that all attachment to sin, even venial sin, be absent.
“If the latter disposition is in any way less than perfect or if the prescribed three conditions are not fulfilled, the indulgence will be partial only...”
- F. The three conditions may be fulfilled several days before or after the performance of the prescribed work; it is, however, fitting that Communion be received and the prayer for the intention of the Sovereign Pontiff be said on the same day the work is performed. The condition of sacramental confession may be fulfilled within a period of about twenty days before or after the work is performed.
