Pastor's Corner 🛓



Dear Faithful,

I would like to post a brief version of the sermon for the Holy Family as this week's Pastor's Corner because the family is the first cell of society, and families are under attack more than ever.

Mother Teresa said: "I think the world today is upside down, and is suffering so much, because there is so very little love in the homes and in family life. We have no time for our children, we have no time for each other; there is no time to enjoy each other. If we could only bring back into our lives the life that Jesus, Mary and Joseph lived in Nazareth, if we could make our homes another Nazareth, I think that peace and joy would reign in the world."

-A lot of people get discouraged when they compare their families with the Holy Family. A lot of people also get discouraged when they set out with all the good will they can muster to try to make the home another Nazareth and they are met with coldness, neglect, or even hatred and cruelty from another member of the family.

-We must resolve with God's grace to play our part in the family equation whether it is met with cooperation or opposition from other members of the family. We will one day appear before Our Lord and He won't ask us what others have done, but what we ourselves did.

-If Our Lord appeared to you today and told you: "you get to redo this last month of your life. And when this month is over, you will die and appear before me." Would you live those 30 days differently than the way you did? How so? Would you have acted differently with those He gave you, with those who surround you? How so? If you knew for sure: 30 days and it's D-day. What would you have done differently? In this tense situation or in this difficult circumstance, what would you have done differently?
