Sun. 16 April at 3 pm. We will have Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament with recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet, followed by Benediction.

Divine Mercy Sunday Promises & Requirements

Our Lord's promise to grant complete forgiveness of sins and punishment on the Feast of Mercy is recorded three times in the *Diary of Saint Maria Faustina Kowalska*, each time in a slightly different way:

"I want to grant a complete pardon to the souls that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion on the Feast of My mercy." (1109)

"Whoever approaches the Fount of Life on this day will be granted complete remission of sins and punishment." (300)

"The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion will obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment." (699)

Thus to fittingly observe the Feast of Mercy, we should:

1. Celebrate the Feast on the Sunday after Easter;
2. sincerely repent of all our sins;
3. place our complete trust in Jesus;
4. go to Confession, **preferably before that Sunday;**
5. receive Holy Communion on the day of the Feast;
6. venerate* the image of the Divine Mercy; and
7. be merciful to others, through our actions, words, and prayers on their behalf.

*To venerate a sacred image or statue simply means to perform some act or make some gesture of deep religious respect toward it because of the person whom it represents—in this case our Most Merciful Savior.

Pastor's Corner



Dear Faithful,

As we enter into the holiest time of the year, where we relive everything Our Savior suffered for our sake, consider prayerfully the Preface of the Holy Cross that is now used in the Liturgy:

It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks to Thee, holy Lord, Father almighty, eternal God: Who didst establish the salvation of mankind on the tree of the Cross: that whence death rose, thence also life might rise again, and that he who overcame by a tree, by a tree also might be overcome: through Christ our Lord. Through Whom Angels praise Thy Majesty, Dominations worship, Powers stand in awe. The Heavens and the hosts of heaven with blessed Seraphim unite, exult, and celebrate. And we entreat that Thou wouldst bid our voices too be heard with theirs, singing with lowly praise: — Sanctus.

I hope to see you at the Parish Mission this week. Make it a holy week!

Please know that you and your families are in my prayers, especially at the Altar of Our Lord.
