# Pastor's Corner



Dear Faithful,

Confession is a Sacrament instituted by Our Lord, whereby sins committed after Baptism are forgiven through the absolution of the priest. You'll recall Christ gave this power to His Apostles after He rose from the dead: "He said therefore to them again: Peace be to you. As the Father hath sent me, I also send you. When he had said this, he breathed on them; and he said to them: Receive ye the Holy Ghost. Whose sins you shall forgive, they are forgiven them: and whose sins you shall retain, they are retained." John 20:21

Confession is a wonderful Sacrament where (if we prepared well and have the right dispositions) we hear the words of Christ: "I forgive you your sins."

#### **How to go to Confession**

Of course, it goes without saying: prepare. Examine your conscience. Have your list ready.

- 1. The priest says, "In the Name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Ghost. Amen."
- 2. You say, "Bless me, Father, for I have sinned." You then say how long it has been since your last Confession.
- 3. You tell the priest your sins simply and forth-rightly (if mortal sin, give kind & approximate number).
- 4. The priest will give brief advice, if time permits, and will assign you a penance and ask you to make a good act of contrition.
- 5. You pray the Act of Contrition (see prayer below).
  - 6. The priest then gives you absolution.
- 7. The priest will then say: "Go in peace, your sins are forgiven you," (or words to that effect).
- 8. You can say "Thank you," (or words to that effect).
- 9. You leave the confessional and carry out the assigned penance.

#### **The Act of Contrition**

O my God, I am heartily sorry for having offended Thee and I detest all my sins because I dread the loss of Heaven and the pains of hell. But most of all, because they offend Thee, my God, Who art all good and deserving of all my love. I firmly resolve, with the help of Thy grace, to confess my sins, to do penance and to amend my life. Amen.
