it a high degree of glory in heaven.

- 11. By the recitation of the Rosary you shall obtain all that you ask of me.
- 12. Those who propagate the holy Rosary shall be aided by me in their necessities.
- 13. I have obtained from my Divine Son that all the advocates of the Rosary shall have for intercessors the entire celestial court during their life and at the hour of their death.
- 14. All who recite the Rosary are my beloved children and the brothers and sisters of my only Son, Jesus Christ.
- 15. Devotion for my Rosary is a great sign of predestination.

The month of May is dedicated to Our Blessed Mother. If you have let the Rosary fall by the wayside, this is an excellent opportunity to get back to a daily Rosary. Go with Mary and she will lead you to her Divine Son.

Dear Faithful,

The Rosary is a powerful prayer. Given to St. Dominic by none other than the Blessed Mother herself, it has been a tremendous instrument of grace and sanctification. Many a sinner has been converted through the faithful recitation of the Rosary. Many a lukewarm soul has been enkindled with a love for God worthy of a saint. But don't take my word for it! Here is what our Blessed Mother herself promised St. Dominic:

- 1. Those who faithfully serve me by the recitation of the Rosary shall receive signal graces.
- 2. I promise my special protection and the greatest graces to all those who shall recite the Rosary.
- 3. The Rosary shall be a powerful armor against hell. It will destroy vice, decrease sin, and defeat heresies.
- 4. The recitation of the Rosary will cause virtue and good works to flourish. It will obtain for souls the abundant mercy of God.
