Pastor's Corner



Dear Parishioners,

As I mentioned from the pulpit, His Excellency Bishop Knestout came for the first time ever to visit our parish on Tuesday, May 16th 2023.

He had planned to come prior to the pandemic and shutdown of 2020 and for obvious reason, we had to cancel.

You'll recall a few months ago, we wrote a letter to His Excellency after we found out we were targeted when the dreadful FBI reports were leaked. We thanked him for his kind words defending us and also for defending religious freedom. He stated firmly: *"A preference for traditional forms of worship and holding closely to the Church's teachings on marriage, family, human sexuality, and the dignity of the human person does not equate with extremism."* His Excellency contacted us shortly after, expressing his desire to come by and meet the priests, the staff and committee members of our parish. It was a very positive and encouraging visit. He stayed with us all afternoon prior to his going to St. Edward's for Confirmations that evening. Here are what I consider highlights of the meetings:

- His paternal care for our parish, its members and families. I think he was genuinely pleased to hear from parishioners how much this parish means to them and their families.
- His attention to our concerns and worries, namely the restrictions on the TLM and the recent FBI fumble.
- His assurance that we very much have our place in his diocese. He is grateful for our status as a personal parish and that we are well-established in the Diocese of Richmond.

I expressed to His Excellency our appreciation for his support and assured him of our prayers. He thanked us and asked us to keep on fostering good, faithful, devout and balanced families. He would like to come back and assist at a Mass in choir (hopefully on a Sunday) and meet more of his faithful.
