I have been meaning to write a corner on parish vocations. Due to some recent news, I thought this would be a good occasion.

As of now, six vocations have issued from St. Joseph Parish. This includes:

-Mr. Sam McPeak (Diocese of Richmond & Military Archdiocese)

-Mr. Paul Kemp (FSSP, Our Lady of Guadalupe Seminary in Denton, NE)

That's right! It is my joy to announce that our head Master of Ceremonies and president of the St. Stephen Altar Guild, Mr. Paul Kemp, has applied and been accepted into the Fraternity seminary in Nebraska.

If you have attended the 7 am Low Mass during the week within the past three years or attended Solemn High Masses for big parish occasions, you have certainly seen Paul serve very reverently at the Altar. His acceptance into seminary is an honor for our parish.

Both of our seminarians, Paul & Sam, are in the process of discerning God's call to the Eternal Priesthood of Our Lord Jesus Christ.

-Paul earned a Bachelor's in Accounting from the College of William & Mary and a Master's in Accounting from Villanova University. He is set to begin his 1st year of the 7-year formation in Denton, NE at the end of the summer.

-Sam graduated from the University of Richmond with degrees in history and music. He was attending graduate school at George Mason University for European History when he discerned to apply for seminary for the Diocese of Richmond and to be a chaplain candidate for the army. He is beginning his second year in the Theological College in Washington D.C. and is co-sponsored with the Archdiocese for the Military Services as an army chaplain candidate.
