They sit at a table for a meal that begins with a blessing rather than on a street corner or behind a dumpster. There are times when someone will come in and just looking at them makes us feel we are feeding Jesus. We are also able to provide other necessities such as clothing, sleeping bags and backpacks, through the generosity of our parishioners who regularly fill the bin in our vestibule to overflowing.

Pastor's Corner



Dear Parishioners,

I wanted to draw your attention to one of the works of mercy in which our parish participates. I hope by knowing how it works, you may feel more comfortable volunteering.

St. Peter Pro Cathedral provides dinner for the hungry every Wednesday evening from 4:45 pm until 6 pm. The majority of those served are also homeless and the average number of dinners served is 125!

Each week the dinner is prepared and served by different parishes within the Richmond Diocese. In the past, months containing five Wednesdays required one of these parishes to provide and serve a meal twice. In 2019, our parish began to fill this gap. This means we provide and serve four times a year. Our generosity in providing these dinners is greatly appreciated by the guests who are fed as well as by the staff at St. Peter.

Here is how it works:

There is a small team who decides what will be served. We alternate between two menus to make it easier for those who volunteer to cook.

Several weeks prior to our day to serve, an announcement with the date of the dinner is put in the bulletin and sign-up sheets for what is needed are then put on the bulletin board in the hallway outside our library. This information includes the chosen menu, details for cooking (including recipe and number of servings needed), and side dish items and beverages that can be purchased. The paper products are provided by St. Peter.

Sometimes we purchase main menu items and ask for donations towards the purchase. An example is fried chicken, which is a favorite with the guests, and the gratitude they show is priceless.

As noted on the sign-up board, all items need to be delivered to Fr. Adrian Hall the day of the dinner no later than 3 pm. It is then transported by our team lead to St. Peter for any final prep before serving.

Serving volunteers arrive at St. Peter by 4 pm. The room is set up and serving lines organized so that serving can begin around 4:45 pm. Before anyone begins eating, there is always a blessing. Often this is done by a priest.

Our goal is to always have enough food left over for "seconds" or "takeout." This is often the only food many of our guests receive for a couple of days.
