Pastor's Corner



Dear Faithful,

As announced, the RCIA class will begin on September 7th, and will meet from 6-7:30 pm. Every year we receive a number of converts. The class is also open to anyone who wants to learn or review their Catechism. For the past three years I have been using The Question & Answer Catholic Catechism by The Servant of God, Fr. John Hardon S.J. It is a brief and precise synthesis of the Catholic Faith. Nothing substantial is omitted and everything necessary for salvation is treated. I ask the participants to read the assigned sections before class and to bring any questions they have on the material to class. This usually makes for good discussions, clarifications and distinctions. The main sections we cover are: The Apostles' Creed, The Ten Commandments, The Beatitudes, The Sacraments, Prayer and Liturgy.

St. Mother Teresa of Calcutta endorsed this catechism. She wrote: *"This catechism is a clear exposition of the teachings of the Church. It should be taught in schools and colleges, in religious formation programs, and in the family. Written in simple style, it is easy to understand, and it leaves no doubt in the mind as to what is required of us by the Church, as children of God and followers of Jesus Christ. To be fruitful, our study of catechism must be a prayer, for if we pray, the fruit of prayer is deepening of faith and we will believe, and if we believe we will love, and if we really love we will be able to go and proclaim the good news to the poor—through works of love—that are always works of peace. My prayer for you who use this book is that through its use you may grow in the knowledge of the faith taught by Christ through his Church and so become holy as your heavenly Father is holy."*

The goal is to know Christ and to love Him. Is the Lord calling me to learn or to review my catechism?
