Membership and the commitments that follow it are automatically renewed each year on the feast of the Chair of St. Peter (February 22) unless expressly determined otherwise.

Pastor's Corner



Dear Faithful,

Everyone wants to know what they can do to help the Church in this broken world. The way we fix it is through the grace of God. Our Lord has founded the Church in this world to sanctify our souls through the sacraments. We come in direct contact with the sacraments at our parishes, and specifically through our priests. While we priests of the Priestly Fraternity of Saint Peter work diligently in our parishes to sanctify your souls, your prayers and support in our work are really the key to our success. One of the best ways to provide this support is to join the ranks of the Confraternity of Saint Peter.

What is the Confraternity? It is a society, which gathers those who feel close to the Priestly Fraternity of Saint Peter and who wish to support its charism through prayer and sacrifices. Thus the Confraternity contributes to the service of the Church through supporting numerous vocations, the sanctification of priests, and their pastoral endeavors.

What does a member of the Confraternity of St. Peter do? Members commit themselves to:

Daily: 1) Pray one decade of the holy Rosary for the sanctification of our priests and for priestly vocations. 2) Recite the Confraternity prayer.

Yearly: 3) Have the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass offered once for these intentions.

What spiritual benefit do members receive from the Confraternity? Their commitments place the members among our most faithful benefactors, and as such, among the particular recipients of our priests' and seminarians' daily prayers. The Holy Sacrifice of the Mass is offered each month for the members of the Confraternity in each area.

In addition, you get an opportunity to gain several plenary indulgences (under the usual conditions) granted in 2007 by Pope Benedict XVI: 1. On the day of your admission to the Confraternity. 2. On February 22, the Feast of the Chair of St. Peter. 3. On June 29, the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul.

Aside from these three plenary indulgences, you can gain a partial indulgence "whenever you partake in pious or charitable activities as members of the Confraternity."
