Illness? Stay Home.

I would like to recall some basic principles regarding church attendance when ill. Keep in mind the Catechism of the Catholic Church does not say that you must be “seriously ill” to have just reason to miss Mass. It says that illness (without qualification) constitutes a “serious reason” that justifies missing Mass on a Sunday or holy day.

Hopefully these questions will help one make a prudent decision.

-Am I contagious? (If so, please stay home!)

-Can I travel safely without putting my life or others’ in danger due to the effects of my illness?

-Can I sit through Mass without running relays to the bathroom?

-Should I “tough it out” and attend even though I am sick and do not feel well but could contaminate someone for whom a flu might be lethal?

-Is my immune system compromised (from a condition, or sickness) and the slightest illness would be severe?

-Must I stay back to care for someone who is sick?

Women’s Silent Retreat Registration

The parish is hosting a silent retreat for women ages 18 and up, Fri-Sun., June 21-23, 2024 at the Roslyn Retreat Center on River Road. This traditional retreat will be led by Fr. Anthony Mastroeni.

The retreat begins on Friday evening with Holy Mass at 4pm at the Retreat Center, followed by dinner. The first conference is after dinner; silence will begin at that time and last for the rest of the retreat.

On Saturday, there will be several conferences, times for confession/quiet reflection, and a Holy Hour.

The retreat concludes on Sunday with Holy Mass, breakfast, a closing conference, and a Q&A session.

The cost, which includes lodging, meals, and snacks from Friday dinner through Sunday breakfast, is \$295 for single rooms with a private bathroom, and \$270 for rooms with a roommate and a shared bathroom. Shared rooms are limited.

Registration begins Sunday, 10 December for St. Joseph Parish parishioners; registration will open to other women on 15 January. Registration forms are on the bulletin board in the hallway near the Parish Library. Return the completed form to the office either in person during office hours, or through the letter slot in the office door. Payment is due at registration, made payable to St. Joseph Parish. Please note "Women's Retreat" on the memo line of your check. If you prefer to pay with cash, please clearly mark the envelope with your name and “Women’s Retreat.” Your place is not reserved until payment is received.

Periods of quiet, peace, prayer, and reflection are vital in our pursuit of holiness. Come hear some powerful talks geared directly toward women, enjoy some quiet time for reflection, plus have time for Adoration, Benediction, Confession, and daily Latin Mass.

Pastor’s Corner



Dear Faithful,

The season of Advent is upon us! It begins a New Year as far as the Liturgical cycle goes. It behooves us to look at this past year and reflect. What if this was my last year? Would I be satisfied with it? Was it a fruitful year spiritually speaking? Did I set goals, practical goals? Did I structure my spiritual life? Did I make a list of non-negotiables and try to keep to them?

Unfortunately, rooted in fallen human nature, there is a certain lack of fortitude, a lack of commitment especially regarding the spiritual life. There is a great term for it in French: *mollesse*. It comes from the Latin *mollitia*. There is not really a counterpart for it in English; these translations come close: softness, listlessness, lack of energy, sluggishness, sloth. What it translates into in the spiritual life is a form of effeminacy: a shrinking away from a goal difficult to obtain. (Very different from ‘femininity’ which denotes qualities or attributes regarded as characteristic of women, which is something beautiful and ordained by God).

We should be realistic: the spiritual life is hard work. It is a commitment. It will not always be easy. I will have to face myself, my pride, my misery. I will have to learn humility, to depend on God. But the wonders and the graces and the fulfillment I will find in my faith will far outweigh any effort I can put in. Will I commit?

If we do not have a spiritual life or if it is not structured, I suggest at the very least 4 pillars, 4 non-negotiables in our resolutions for this coming year:

-15 minutes a day of mental prayer (At least)

-Daily spiritual reading

-Frequenting the Sacraments (Confession at least monthly and Holy Communion, if possible, more often than just once a week)

-The Rosary daily

May this year not be a waste spiritually. At its end, we will be one year closer to our death. Will this be our last one?
