Pastor's Corner



Dear Faithful.

As the feast of the Epiphany draws near, we meditate on this "manifestation" of Our Lord. The wisemen come from afar bearing gifts of wondrous significance: gold for a King, incense for His Divinity, and myrrh for His burial. What a beautiful manifestation of Christ's identity and the purpose for which He came into our midst!

Epiphany water will be blessed on the eve of the feast. Blessed chalk will be available for the head of each family to bless the entrance of their home.

Here is a little tutorial on what should be done at the main entrances of your homes:

-The finished inscription should look like this:

20 + C + M + B + 24

- The following words in bold are spoken aloud by the head of the family. As he speaks, he writes - asking the parent of a disruptive child to take the part of the inscription listed in italics.

> The three wise men, Caspar, C Melchior, M and Balthasar, B followed the star of God's Son who became

two thousand 20 twenty-four years ago. 24

Crosses are added from left to right as follows:

May Christ bless our dwelling, +

& remain with us throughout the new year, + & grant that our comings and goings +

will be in search of truth. +

Almighty God, incline your ear. May you bless us and all who are gathered here. Send your holy angel who will defend us and fill with grace all who live here. Amen.

Thank you for your generosity. Please know that you and your families are in my prayers, especially at the Altar of Our Lord.
