especially with the help of many dedicated volunteers. Notably, two vocations were fostered at this time: Hélène Fabiato (Sr. Marie- Hélène) made vows with the Sisters of the Visitation at Monte Maria Monastery in Rockville, Virginia in May, 2001; Fr. Neal Nichols was ordained a priest for the Fraternity of St. Peter in June, 2001.

In 2001, the time had come for the community to find its own property. With Bishop Sullivan's approval and by means of several generous bequests, the community acquired a church building in Bon Air. The work of changing a former Pentecostal church into a Catholic church, however, required some serious renovations. The whole direction of the church was reversed, and the Pentecostal stage, pulpit, and baptismal pool were replaced by a Catholic altar, altar steps and communion rail. Statuary acquired with the help of sacristan Rob Welch added to the Catholic transformation. On November 3, 2002, Bishop Sullivan presided at the Mass of dedication. In a surprise move, he elevated the community to a canonical Catholic parish, saying: "Why did I say ves? I said ves because the church and specifically Pope John Paul II said ves . . . we are all equal in God's eyes . . . And so today this church is a visible sign that you have a permanent home and that you - St. Joseph's Church is here to stay.'

The new St. Joseph Parish of Bon Air experienced a period of exciting growth. Being master of its own house meant that daily Masses, classes and social events were convened with greater freedom.

Eventually, another Benedictine, Fr. Joseph Mary Lukyamuzi came on to help Fr. Adrian. The Parish organized religious education, a Catholic lending library, and a religious goods gift shop. Several renovations were achieved, such as our beautiful daily Mass chapel and grand vestibule.

After 20 years of faithful service, the founding pastor retired for a second time. Bishop Francis Xavier DiLorenzo, "In order to ensure continuity in ministry for the future," invited the Priestly Fraternity of Saint Peter, a society which specializes in the Extraordinary Form, to serve the parish. Since July 2011, the Fraternity has supplied two priests to staff the parish. The Mass remains the center of the devotional life of the parish. In support of this, other devotions are actively encouraged, such as the Sacrament of Confession, Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, and public recitation of the rosary.

As testimony to God's grace, the parish is now home to 300 families and new vocations are continuing to be nourished. St Joseph Parish has abundant reasons to give glory to God: the blessings of the past, the security of the present moment, and the hope for the future.

As of 2024, we now count over 550 families and we add to our vocations: another ordained priest, a solemnly professed Carmelite sister, and two seminarians. We should be so thankful to God and His Providence for His blessings.

I would also like to thank you for your generosity and support, without which none of this would be possible. May God reward you!

Pastor's Corner



Dear Parishioners,

One of the founders of St. Joseph Parish, Mr. Charles Furlough, has gone to his eternal reward. He received the Sacrament of Extreme Unction and the Apostolic Pardon on the very morning of his last day, April 17, 2024. We keep him in our prayers, as dutiful Catholics and fellow parishioners. May he rest in peace.

I was looking through our archives to review all that Mr. Furlough made happen for our parish. It is a story of true grit. Our parish really has an extraordinary history, considering the climate and circumstances it emerged from and how much it has grown since. We have much to be grateful for. We have what we have today, thanks to the sacrifices and perseverance of many, among whom we certainly count Mr. Furlough. The following excerpt of St. Joseph Parish was featured in the Richmond Diocese Bicentennial Edition "Shine Like Stars." It gives a brief overview of our parish history:

One of many treasures of the Catholic Church is the Traditional Latin Mass. Its beauty unveils itself in the depths of a faithful heart. In the last quarter of the 20th century, those who sought the "Extraordinary Form of the Roman Rite" had no place to call home. Two hopeful and determined men, Charles Furlough and Michael Reardon, requested a home from Bishop Walter Sullivan in 1990. After some negotiations, the bishop gave his approval with the understanding that this new group would be a ministry of St. Benedict's Parish. Fr. Adrian Harmening, OSB, the recently retired principal of Benedictine High School, agreed to be its chaplain. On May 12, 1991, 35 people gathered in the chapel at the old orphanage, St. Joseph Villa, and assisted Bishop Sullivan in offering the inaugural Mass. St. Joseph Traditional Latin Mass Chapel was born.

The community was the first of its kind in the U.S. and received some national attention. It drew both young and old, from near and far. The chapel became a destination for Catholics thirsting for this kind of ancient liturgy, where Latin and Gregorian Chant had pride of place. Attendance soon grew to a consistent 200 faithful. For 10 years the community flourished,
