Per Chesterfield County Police: "It has been brought to my attention that there has been an increase in incidents of individuals soliciting for money at houses of worship within the county. Some of these solicitors are Romanian and may bring small children with them for sympathy's sake. One of our officers recognized one of the subjects that scammed a church out of \$2500.00 last year. When the subject was approached by the officer and offered resources the subject refused and was then asked by staff to leave the property.

"I know that part of your mission is to give to those that do not have, and that you want to be welcoming and protective of the less fortunate. Unfortunately, there are those that will take advantage of those with good hearts. If you are solicited or ask for help, I strongly encourage you to offer resources or other assistance prior to giving cash. This will both protect you and may be more appropriate assistance to those in need."

Pastor's Corner



Dear Faithful,

June is the month of the Sacred Heart. Here is a passage on the origin of the feast:

The Feast of the Sacred Heart was established in order that the faithful might honor with more devotion and zeal, under the symbol of the Sacred Heart, the love of Jesus Christ, which induced Him not only to suffer and to die for the redemption of mankind, but also to institute the Sacrament of His Body and Blood in commemoration of His death. Though the devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus is of great antiquity in the Church, yet it was reserved to Margaret Mary Alacocque, of the Order of the Visitation, to make this devotion public. During the Octave of Corpus Christi, in the year 1690, our Blessed Lord appeared to his devoted handmaid, and disclosing to her His Heart, said: "Behold this Heart, which, notwithstanding the burning love for man with which it is consumed and exhausted, meets with no other return from the generality of Christians than sacrilege, contempt, indifference and ingratitude." *Commentary by Fr. Sylvester Juergens S.M. (1894-1969).*

The Church teaches us in the liturgy to approach the Sacred Heart thus:

The Preface of the Sacred Heart

It is truly meet and just, right and for our salvation, that we should at all times and in all places give thanks to Thee, holy Lord, Father almighty, eternal God: Whose will it was that Thine only-begotten Son, while hanging on the Cross, should be pierced by the soldier's lance: that the Heart thus opened should, as from a well of divine bounty, pour over us streams of mercy and of grace: and that the Heart which never ceased to burn with love for us, should be for the devout a haven of rest and for the penitent an open refuge of salvation.
