maintain a two priest schedule with two priests would burn out any priest. Until I came to my senses (in year four) and realized our schedule was not viable, I can't

tell you how many times Fr. Franco covered for me because I was sick or how many times he binated (two Masses on a weekday) because a tragedy required a funeral while we were trying to maintain the regular schedule.

Fr. Franco has a priestly heart. He has left his mark on this parish. Thank you, Father, and God reward you!

I cannot reveal the parish where Fr. Franco is going until it is announced officially. He will be on the road by August 1st. We will have another priest assigned to us but probably not until late August; that is still in the works. Again, I will share that information once it is made official.

Please know that you and your families are in my prayers, especially at the Altar of Our Lord.


